Dear Parish Family,

Parish Highlight:

In June 2023, about 600 people were attending Mass here at *Our Lady of the Assumption Parish*. At that time, we celebrated four weekend Masses: Saturday at 5:00 p.m., and Sunday at 8:30 a.m., 10:00 a.m., and 11:30 a.m.

Our story continues to unfold with both abundant graces and meaningful challenges. By the end of 2024 and moving into 2025, we have grown to more than **1,200 active parishioners** attending five weekend Masses: Saturday at 5:00 p.m., and Sunday at 8:00 a.m., 10:00 a.m., 12:00 p.m., and 7:00 p.m. This growth is a tremendous blessing—but it also brings new responsibilities that we must embrace together, working in unity to sustain and expand God's mission among us.

Our **10:00 a.m. Mass** has now reached full capacity. To accommodate the overflow, we will make use of the **Family Room, Marian Room, and the Parish Hall**, where the Mass will be **livestreamed**. The Hall now features a screen for projecting music and Mass responses, creating a more engaging and prayerful atmosphere for everyone.

Our growth also brings **practical needs**:

- We need more **musicians and volunteers** to serve at our five Masses.
- Increased attendance means higher costs for **septic, water supply, garbage collection** (now twice a month instead of once), **utilities, maintenance, and pastoral staffing**.
- Did you know that our parish is on a **septic system** and we **purchase water from outside**? We also have a **water filtration system** to ensure the safety and quality of our water.

Naturally, this growth places more demand on our **facilities, staff, clergy, and volunteers**. It affects every aspect of parish life—from our programs and mission to the maintenance of our physical space. Yet, with faith, hard work, and unity, we are managing and trusting God to continue guiding us forward.

While we rejoice in our growth, our **donations** have not grown at the same pace. Currently, about **60% of parishioners** contribute regularly to support the parish. To those who give faithfully—thank you! Your generosity sustains our mission.


If you are able to **review your contribution** and possibly increase your giving, your support would make a great difference. And if you have not yet started giving regularly, we warmly invite you to begin today.

Third Sunday of Advent



DID YOU KNOW? that the **candles on the advent wreath** are lit for special intentions? The first purple candle is lit for **hope**, the second purple for **faith**, the pink candle (lit the third week for Gaudete Sunday) is for **joy** and the third purple candle is for **peace**. There is often a central **white** candle in the middle of the wreath called the **Christ candle**. It is lit on Christmas eve to celebrate the arrival of Jesus. Each candle is lit to **remind us of the spiritual preparation** we need to do for the coming of the Christ child.
