God is good—all the time!

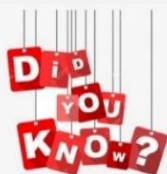

They are in the office for scheduled counselling, arranging marriages, working on paperwork for annulments, sacraments, and so much other administration. Not only that, but they have to be prepared daily and for weekends with all the liturgical happenings, writing homilies, adding faith formation, overseeing the church administration, finances, etc. If that is not enough, they are out for house blessings, communion visits to the homebound, visiting parishioners in hospitals, anointing parishioners, etc. They are also arranging missed sacraments, funerals, anniversaries, convalidations and other celebrations like feast days, memorials, etc. On top of all that, they try to attend our ministry meetings and are on committees in the Diocese and with other religious or charitable organisations.
