Dear Parish Family,

Here is a little history behind the on-going Novena Devotion to the infant of Prague:

THE INFANT OF PRAGUE - The devotion to the Infant Jesus of Prague began in 16th-century Czech lands through the Carmelite friars. According to tradition, the beloved statue once belonged to St. Teresa of Avila, who gave it as a gift that eventually reached Princess Polyxena of Lobkowitz. In a time of hardship for the Carmelites, she presented the statue to them, saying: *"Honor this image and you shall never be poor."* The community soon experienced renewed blessings and support.

The statue portrays the Child Jesus as King:

- **A royal robe** shows Christ the Infant King of the Universe.
- **A globe in His left hand** symbolizes His care and protection over the whole world.
- **His right hand raised in blessing** represents Jesus blessing us; the two raised fingers signify His human and divine natures, and the joined thumb and fingers symbolize the Holy Trinity.

During wartime the statue was damaged and forgotten until a Carmelite priest rediscovered it and restored its hands. Tradition says that in 1637 the Infant spoke to him: *"Have mercy on Me and I will have mercy on you. Give Me hands and I will give you peace. The more you honor Me, the more I will bless you."*

For nearly four centuries, countless blessings and miracles have been reported through devotion to the Divine Infant. The statue is venerated today in the Carmelite Church of Our Lady of Victory in Prague.

The Infant of Prague reminds us that God holds our lives in His hands and invites us to trust Him with childlike humility, simplicity, and faith.

May you and your families receive many miracles, graces and blessings from the infant Jesus.

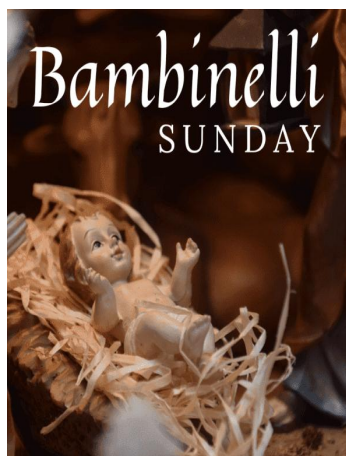
