

Dear Parish Family,

Although Christmas is over and we are now back in Ordinary time, we still have a lot to celebrate! Just as the readings of the last two weeks talk of Jesus' start to public ministry with His baptism, we are also starting our year of sacraments. Last week, we had 8 baptisms to start the year off. The Rite of Christian Initiation for Children began last week. These 21 children will be learning about our faith, sacraments and the mass. They will be baptised at the Easter Vigil. We also have 3 adults who will be receiving their confirmation and we have 11 adults in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (who will also be baptised at the Easter Vigil!). Most of these adults and children will be receiving four sacraments. We also have children who have missed their reconciliation or communion due to covid getting their first sacraments on various weekends in January.

Along with this instruction at our Church, our 6 elementary schools are getting ready for confirmations. They are receiving reconciliation at school and will be coming to the parish in the coming weeks for retreats and rehearsals. Our grade 2's are also learning about the sacraments of reconciliation and communion in preparation for their sacraments in May. When you see these families at Church, please congratulate them. It is a time to be joyful for all of us.

Please pray for our adults and children during this time that the sacraments they receive strengthen their relationship with God and fully integrate them into the Body of Christ.






DID YOU KNOW? that Holy water is water that is **blessed** through a specific rite for our use? This blessing makes ordinary water a “**sacramental**” (sacred signs instituted by the Church to prepare people to receive grace). Holy Water serves as a **reminder of our baptism** and **our union with Christ**. It sanctifies our daily life. Holy Water is found at fonts at the front and side entrances of the Church and in the hall when we celebrate mass. You can also bring holy water home with you to bless yourself daily.

Word of God Sunday

On **January 24/25**, we Celebrate the “**Word of God**” (often called “Bible Sunday”). It is important to have at least one Catholic bible in your home. As a family, it is a good practise to read the Bible as a family daily.

The Word of God should guide us in our lives. We will be selling bibles in the coming weeks. We have hardcover adult bibles for \$25 and children's bibles for \$40. You can get them blessed after mass by Father.
